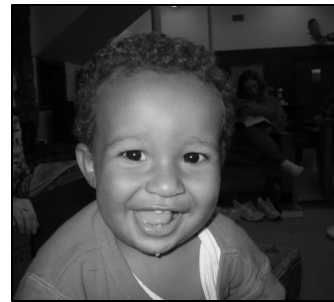




# 2007 Annual Members' Meeting

## Featured Speakers:

Gary Fawver is Professor Emeritus of Outdoor Ministries, George Fox University. He directed Tilikum: Center for Retreats and Outdoor Ministries for 20 years. He loves spending time outdoors with his 9 grandchildren and since retiring has developed a passion for photography.

Mr. Fawver's lecture titled, "The Irreplaceable Component: The Power of the Outdoor Setting," will address the reality that more and more people go outdoors less and less. The result is an increase in physical, spiritual, emotional and social ailments. He suggests that when camps use the outdoor setting to do camping correctly they can provide an antidote for those maladies. He asks, "How can Drift Creek Camp take advantage of God's great outdoors?"

Sarah Deumling is a Mom, Grandmother, and former school teacher turned forester. Since 1996, she has managed 2000 acres of forest in the Eola Hills west of Salem. She will share her insight on "Forest Management in the Drift Creek Watershed; Past, Present and Future"

Tom Brenneman is a retired junior high science and math teacher. In this session, he plans to share the diversity of the macroinvertebrates (mostly aquatic insects) found in Drift Creek. Participants will need boots (waders or hip boots), appropriate clothing, and possibly a walking stick.
